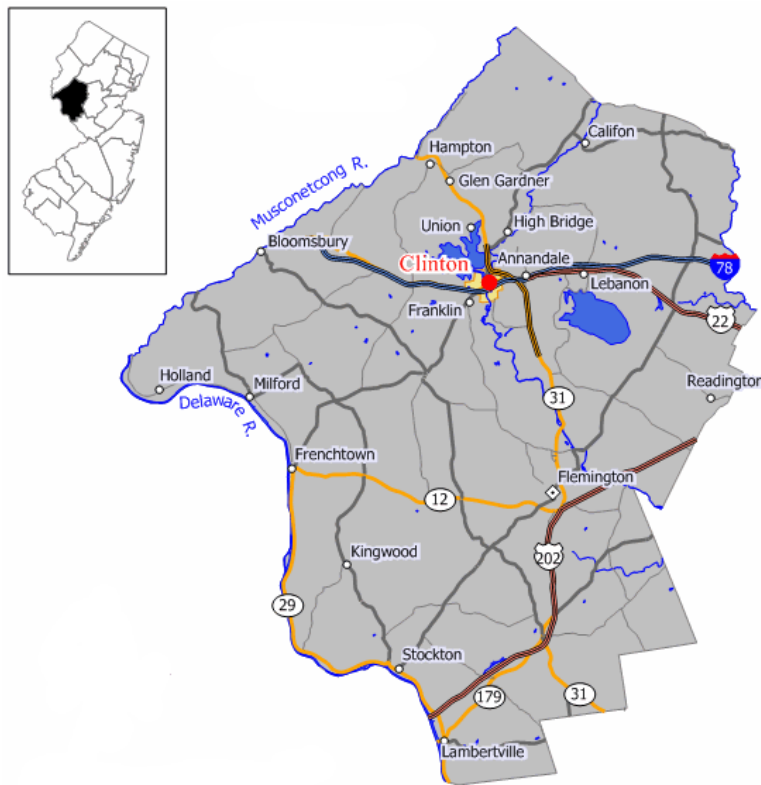

Appendix G – Hunterdon County Scanning Information and notes

Past (This portion is from the Hunterdon County Website)

Hunterdon County Communications was established in 1976 when a group of citizens, some from various Police, Fire, and Rescue depts. along with the Hunterdon County Board of Chosen Freeholders decided to put all of the Emergency Services together into one facility, along with having a county wide 9-1-1 number for county residents to call in the event of an emergency. After some opposition from various town and townships, Hunterdon County hired it's first 11 dispatchers in May 1976, and officially went on the air in June 1976. A house was purchased in Cherryville, Franklin Township and was converted for use as a dispatch center. Once completed and on the air, Hunterdon County Communications would become New Jersey's first 24 hour County wide 9-1-1 system in the state as well as being the first county system that would cover all dispatching for the Police, Fire, and Rescue Dept's. as well as the County Sheriffs dept, Prosecutors Office, and the County Road Dept. At present, HCCC has 35 dispatcher's, of which 8 are part time. The original dispatch center building only had 3 consoles, but in 1988, the county moved into a new and modern building on an adjacent property to the old center. This new building would have a much larger dispatch room where today we have 6 dispatching consoles and 2 call taker positions set up as well as an administrative wing and training room.

Present

Hunterdon County Communications continues to be the sole dispatching center for Hunterdon County. Outside agencies, such as the NJ Park Police, have the ability to communicate with the county on TAC 1. Fire & EMS paging is done on AMB 2 now, however the fire paging is simulcast on FIRE 1.

Police

Municipal Police operate on 3 Police channels. Police 2 covers units North and East, Police 3 covers units South and West, and Police 5 covers units in the central area (Clinton Town, Twp. And Franklin Twp.) only between 7am and 10pm. Dispatchers will make an announcement to have the units switch over at the designated times. Most local police have a local frequency that they can talk on outside of the county channel plan. County Police (Sheriff's, Prosecutors etc.) operate on TAC 6. TAC 6 is also shared with the county OEM. For towns without a local dept., NJSP Perryville Barracks cover towns in the North, and NJSP Kingwood Barracks cover towns to the south. The NJ State Human Services Police patrols Hagedorn and Hunterdon Developmental Centers. Although they do not cover any individual town, they often do patrol Glen Gardner and will respond to backup local police if requested. Califon Borough is covered by Washington Twp. Police (Morris County) and utilize their own radio system.

Fire

Fire units continue to use VHF low band, however most units now have VHF radios. In addition, several towns utilize cross-banding so they can stay on one frequency. Fire units are responsible for the Helicopter landing zones, and use TAC 1 as the primary frequency. In the even TAC 1 is in use, the Parks channel will be used instead. Flemington has a repeater setup that is activated during an incident to ensure Fire & EMS can communicate. The county HazMat team either operates on TAC 1, or Police 6 (which the county police shares with OEM).

EMS

All EMS units are Dispatched on AMB 2, and use AMB 5 (pronounced AMBO) for operations. Many squads have their own private channels as well. Hunterdon County dispatches 3 Hunterdon Medical Center Paramedic Units. EMS 1 which covers the central part of the county, EMS 2, which covers southern Warren County and northern Hunterdon, and EMS 3 which covers the southern end of the county. In addition, Medic 682 may come in from Somerset County if needed. 27 Rescue is a paid EMS unit that covers Northern Hunterdon County during the day and is actually a Clinton EMS unit. 32 Rescue is a daytime partnership between Readington EMS and Branchburg EMS in Somerset County.

Appendix G – Hunterdon County Scanning Information and notes

Emergency Management

OEM Units will either operate on TAC 1, or TAC 6. The County has a command bus known as CP-86. There is also a repeater just for communications with the Bus. OEM units may use that repeater as well, or may operate on simplex. The county also has some specialized units, such as Gators, Cert Trailer, and a new Communications Trailer which is in the process of being built. Hunterdon County RACES will operate on the Cherryville Repeater Association repeaters and the PL is often dropped during emergencies to simplify communications.

Future

In 2006, construction began for a new and much larger dispatch room that will allow them have as many as 12 consoles in one room. Hunterdon County Communications runs mainly with computer based systems including phone and street locator systems. Currently, the county has UHF repeaters that are simulcasting with the existing VHF channels.

Appendix H – Hunterdon County Fire & EMS Designation Change

**** This has changed once again and will be updated in the near future ****

As of October 23, 2007 HC Dept of Public Safety adopted a policy to change the Fire and EMS unit designations. The following is PHASE-1 of the NIMS compliant policy change, and is effective immediately.

1. Hunterdon County will recognize the following officer designations for radio usage: chief, deputy, assistant, battalion, captain, lieutenant, sergeant, and supervisor.
2. Hunterdon County will recognize the following safety titles: FP (Fire police), and FM (Fire Marshal).
3. Fire companies will continue to use their (2) digit station number, and the rescue squads will use a (3) digit station number by adding a "5" to their current station number. Additionally, up to 4 of each officer rank will be allowed with the exception of Chief. If only 1 of the officer rank exists than only the 2 digit (Fire) or 3 digit (EMS) station number needs to be placed after the officer rank. If 2 or more of any officer rank exists than all the officers in that rank will have a 3 digit (Fire) or 4 digit (EMS) number.
4. Hunterdon County will discontinue the use if the old officer designations of Fire (60,70,80,90-99) and Rescue (50,50A - 50Z)
5. Additionally, during the first phase of implementation, utilizing the apparatus standards approved by the Fire and EMS Chiefs Associations, dept's can begin to place the TYPE of unit in front of the currently used vehicle numbers. For example:
"91-89" will now be called "Rescue 91-89"
"23-51" will now be called "BLS 23-51"
"48-58" will now be called "Car 48-58"
"26-69" will now be called "Quint 26-69"
